1 CHAIR NORDENBERG: Senator Costa and Senator Kim Ward are in Hearing Room No. 1, and Leader Benninghoff and Representative Bradford should be appearing on the screen momentarily.

5 Good morning, everyone. My name is Mark 6 Nordenberg. I serve as Chair of the Pennsylvania Legislative 7 Reapportionment Commission. The hour of 9 a.m. having 8 arrived, I want to call this meeting of the Commission to 9 order. In doing so, let me welcome everyone who has joined us, either in the Capitol complex or through the livestream. 10 I also should note that a video of this session, as well as 11 the agenda and the resolutions to be considered, will be 12 13 posted on our website shortly after the meeting.

14 Let me extend special thanks to the other 15 Commissioners who have made time for this brief administrative 16 meeting at what is probably the busiest time of the year for 17 them as they deal with the State budget and a range of other 18 important legislative matters. Given the press of that 19 business, these Commissioners are joining us from various 20 locations within the Capitol complex. That distinguished 21 group includes Senator Kim Ward, the Senate Majority Leader; 22 and Senator Jay Costa, the Democratic Leader of the Senate, 23 who both are in Hearing Room No. 1. It also includes 24 Representative Kerry Benninghoff, the Majority Leader of the 25 House of Representatives. Representative Joanna McClinton,

the Democratic Leader of the House of Representatives, is unfortunately speaking at the funeral of a close friend this morning and will not be able to join us. However, Representative Matthew Bradford, the Democratic Chair of the House Appropriations Committee, has joined us to serve as her Deputy this morning. Welcome to you, Representative Bradford.

7 The principal purpose for this morning's meeting 8 is to take some important steps in building the staff that 9 will support our work as we move forward. There are four 10 resolutions on our agenda, and I would propose that we move 11 through them in order.

The first of those resolutions calls for the 12 13 appointment of Cheri M. Mizdail as administrative assistant 14 for the Commission and sets her biweekly salary at \$2,300.00. Ms. Mizdail began working in the Capitol in 1987, and has 15 16 served in both the House and the Senate over the course of her 17 long career in State government. She currently serves as Administrative Assistant in the Office of Administrative 18 19 Services in the Senate. Until his retirement, Ms. Mizdail 20 served as Executive Secretary to former Senator John Rafferty 21 for 16 years. I had a long conversation with Senator Rafferty 22 about her performance in that role. In a conversation in 23 which he rarely used anything but a superlative, he gave her 24 an overall grade of A-plus. In her current position, Ms. 25 Mizdail reports to Ann-Marie Sweeney, someone we have

discussed in the past and will discuss again momentarily. 1 Ms. 2 Sweeney also assesses her performance very positively. Can I ask if there is a motion to approve the 3 4 first resolution, which is Resolution 2A? 5 SENATOR K. WARD: I make that motion. 6 CHAIR NORDENBERG: Is there a second? 7 REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: I second. 8 CHAIR NORDENBERG: Is there any discussion? 9 (There was no response.) CHAIR NORDENBERG: If not, let me call the vote. 10 11 All in favor, please say "aye." 12 SENATOR K. WARD: Aye. 13 SENATOR COSTA: Aye. 14 REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: Aye. 15 REPRESENTATIVE BRADFORD: Aye. 16 CHAIR NORDENBERG: Aye. Any opposed? 17 18 (There was no response.) CHAIR NORDENBERG: The motion carries. 19 20 The second resolution is 2B. At our last meeting, 21 the Commission approved the appointment of Ann-Marie Sweeney as stenographer for the Commission, a role I should note in 22 23 which she is serving this morning. Her name had barely 24 escaped my lips in that earlier session when Senator Costa 25 declared that she was the best conceivable hire I could ever

make, and others weighed in to second that thought. As you know, she currently serves as Chief Official Reporter for the Senate. At that same meeting, more privately, Ms. Sweeney expressed her belief that moving to the Commission full-time would be the best next chapter in her career. And so the second resolution approves her appointment as Director of Administration for the Commission.

8 She has directly relevant experience because she 9 does currently direct an important office within the Senate, and because I am not a Capitol insider, I already have clearly 10 seen how important her knowledge and relationships can be in 11 getting things done. Her biweekly salary will be \$4,780.00. 12 13 In her case, as was the case with Ms. Mizdail, I simply took 14 their current Commonwealth salaries and increased them by 2 15 percent, assuming that there might be a small increase for 16 State employees over the course of the summer.

Is there a motion to approve this resolution? 17 18 SENATOR COSTA: Mr. Chairman, I proudly recommend, 19 nominate, recommend that we have Ann-Marie Sweeney serve as our Director of Administration. It will be our loss in the 20 Senate, we know that, but I think as you indicated, she has 21 22 the qualities and characteristics of being an outstanding 23 Director of Administration. Certainly, her talent and her 2.4 skills are wonderful, but as a person who, as you mentioned, 25 builds relationships is extremely important in this process,

1	so I'm honored to be able to recommend, nominate, or second
2	your motion, whatever it is, I'm there.
З	SENATOR K. WARD: Mr. Chairman, I am also honored
4	to second that motion. That was a motion. Ann-Marie has been
5	such an asset to the Senate, and since I have arrived in the
6	Senate, she has been a steady, steady force there doing her
7	job and making us all feel comfortable, and she is just very
8	professional. I'm glad that she is going to be joining us.
9	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Well, I guess if there is
10	anyone who should feel good about this meeting at its
11	conclusion, it should be Ms. Sweeney.
12	We have a motion and a second. Is there any
13	discussion?
14	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: Mr. Chairman, I just
15	also want to echo those nice comments. She's given great
16	service to our Commonwealth, and I just want to say I
17	appreciate you sending some information ahead of time so we
18	could be even more prepared looking at these nominees in a
19	thorough manner.
20	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Thank you very much.
21	If there's no further discussion, let me ask all
22	in favor of the motion to signify by saying "aye."
23	SENATOR K. WARD: Aye.
24	SENATOR COSTA: Aye.
25	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: Aye.

6	SENATOR COSTA: Congratulations, Ann-Marie.
7	CHAIR NORDENBERG: At our last meeting, the
8	Commission approved the appointment of G. Reynolds Clark as
9	its Executive Director. At that organizational meeting, I
10	reviewed Mr. Clark's distinguished professional career, first
11	as an executive at Westinghouse, and later as a member of the
12	senior leadership team at the University of Pittsburgh. At
13	Pitt he served as both Vice Chancellor for Community and
14	Governmental Relations, and as Chief of Staff for the
15	Chancellor, making many distinctive contributions and also
16	developing an up-close understanding of State government. Mr.
17	Clark also previously served as an elected mayor in suburban
18	Pittsburgh, and as the appointed Executive Director of the
19	State Intergovernmental Cooperation Authority, which exercised
20	oversight over the finances of the City of Pittsburgh.
21	Because Mr. Clark is not a State employee, setting
22	his salary was not quite as straightforward as were the cases
23	of Ms. Mizdail and Ms. Sweeney. However, the biweekly salary
24	of \$6,475.00, which I recommend for him, is just below the
25	midpoint of the salaries of the Chiefs of Staff for the four

1	Caucus Leaders, which seemed a relevant comparable. Also, I
2	should note that the prior Commission appointed not only an
З	Executive Director but a Deputy Executive Director, and we
4	have no intention of filling that second role in this
5	Commission's staff.
6	Again, I would ask if there is a motion to approve
7	Resolution 2C.
8	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: I make
9	SENATOR K. WARD: I make that motion.
10	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: Pardon me, I will
11	acquiesce to the Madam Chair.
12	CHAIR NORDENBERG: And is there a second then?
13	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: I will second the
14	nomination by Senator Ward. Thank you.
15	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Thank you very much.
16	Is there any discussion?
17	(There was no response.)
18	CHAIR NORDENBERG: If not, will all in favor
19	please signify by saying "aye."
20	SENATOR K. WARD: Aye.
21	SENATOR COSTA: Aye.
22	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: Aye.
23	REPRESENTATIVE BRADFORD: Aye.
24	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Aye.
25	Any opposed?

1	(There was no response.)
2	CHAIR NORDENBERG: The motion carries.
3	The final resolution also designates Mr. Clark to
4	serve as the Open Records Officer for the Commission. He did
5	serve as Open Records Officer for the State's
6	Intergovernmental Cooperation Authority while serving as that
7	Authority's Executive Director, so he has experience in that
8	role.
9	Is there a motion to approve Resolution 2D?
10	SENATOR COSTA: So moved, Mr. Chairman.
11	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Second?
12	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: I'll second that.
13	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Thank you very much.
14	Any discussion?
15	(There was no response.)
16	CHAIR NORDENBERG: If not, will all in favor
17	please signify by saying "aye."
18	SENATOR K. WARD: Aye.
19	SENATOR COSTA: Aye.
20	REPRESENTATIVE BENNINGHOFF: Aye.
21	REPRESENTATIVE BRADFORD: Aye.
22	CHAIR NORDENBERG: Aye.
23	Any opposed?
24	(There was no response.)
25	CHAIR NORDENBERG: That motion also carries.

Looking forward, let me offer just a few quick observations. The space to be occupied by the staff of the Commission should be ready at the beginning of next month. I again want to thank House Parliamentarian Clancy Myer and Leader McClinton for locating that space and making it available to us.

7 I have had almost daily interactions with Brent 8 McClintock, the Executive Director of the Legislative Data 9 Processing Center. The Center will be an important partner to 10 the Commission as we move forward with our work, and I cannot 11 begin to adequately thank Executive Director McClintock for 12 the professional help that he already has provided.

Among other topics he and I have discussed, enhancements to the Commission's website, which is maintained by the Center, that will enable citizens to submit suggestions to the Commission as we move forward with our work. We want to make that process as convenient as possible for the people of Pennsylvania, and this will be an important step.

I am very pleased with the individuals we already have recruited to the Commission's small staff. My focus now will be on adding someone with mapping, and more particularly, map assessment expertise. Over the course of recent weeks, I have had numerous discussions both with those positioned to make recommendations and with individuals who would be interested in filling this important role. I plan to bring a

recommendation to you sometime next month.

Finally, and I say this principally for the benefit of the public, the Commission intends to conduct a series of hearings during July and the first part of August before we have received even preliminary Census data. And we almost certainly will have a second stage of hearings after Census data has been received and digested.

8 Consistent with thoughts expressed in our first 9 meeting, we do intend to rely on modern technology to conduct 10 some of these hearings remotely, making it easier for those 11 who are participating to appear before the Commission and to 12 share their views. We will, of course, be giving timely 13 notice of those hearings when they are scheduled.

14Does any other Commissioner have any comments to15make at this point in time?

SENATOR K. WARD: None.

17 CHAIR NORDENBERG: If not, I will end where I 18 began by thanking all of you for making time during this 19 particularly hectic season by wishing you well in your other 20 work and by saying I look forward to reconnecting again soon.

And with that, the meeting is adjourned. Thank
you, again.

Resolution Regarding Administrative Assistant Resolution 2A

It is hereby resolved that Cheri M. Mizdail be appointed Administrative Assistant of the Commission and that she be compensated in the biweekly amount of \$2,300. She will continue to participate in the Commonwealth health and retirement benefits program.

Resolution Regarding Director of Administration Resolution 2B

It is hereby resolved that Ann-Marie Sweeney, who was earlier appointed Stenographer of the Commission, also be appointed Director of Administration, and that she be compensated in the bi-weekly amount of \$4,780. She will continue to participate in the Commonwealth health and retirement benefits program.
